TALENTS FOR CHRIST 2010

What is it? Share Your Talent is an opportunity for young people in grades 6 through 12 to share their talents (abilities, skills, gifts) with youth and adults from other Baptist churches in front of a panel of judges who will evaluate, suggest improvement and grade their talents. Share Your Talent is an expanded and developing program of the Empire State Fellowship of Regular Baptist Churches built upon and in cooperation of the well established National GARBC Talents for Christ Contest.

Where and When is it? Share Your Talent will take place on Saturday, April 17, 2010 from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM at the First Baptist Church in Horseheads. A map can be downloaded. Click the link at the left.

Why be involved? It will be fun, it will help you to develop your talent/ability and build confidence, you will bless others as you minister, meet new friends and be challenged. Some challenges in life are worth attempting - especially when they involve serving Christ. Sharing Your Talent helps you to prepare and to gain skill for serving the Lord. For those who enter the scholarship category, they have the potential of qualifying for college scholarships on the state and national level.

What kind of talent can be shared? About every talent a young person has or is working to develop. Young people in grades 9-12 desiring to be in the **scholarship** category could enter one of these: Bible Knowledge, Brass, Female Public Speaking, Female Voice, Male Voice, Oral Interpretation of Scripture, Piano, preaching, Strings, Visualized Bible Teaching, Woodwinds, and Writing. IF you are not interested in a college scholarship or in grades 6-12, you can share you talent in the "open" (non-scholarship) category which includes all of the above plus art and digital media.

Will groups be allowed to share? There are small and large vocal ensembles, Duets, puppet teams, and drama teams. If your youth group is small, you can join with another church.

What if I have a talent that doesn't fit in one of the above categories? You should plan to share your talent in the category that is called "Variety Hour." This is a wide-open category that will include such instruments as guitar, xylophone, marimba, organ, key board, harp, harmonica, banjo, hand bells, etc. or reciting a poem, yodeling, impersonations, etc. IF you have a unique talent and are wondering IF you could share it, call the chairman to see if it qualifies.

What does it cost to be involved? Unless you decide to enter the Scholarship category or decide to go on to the Nationals in the non-scholarship, there is NO registration fee. It is free to every young person. During the day on April 17, the church will provide a lunch for those who desire it at a very reasonable price.

How do I sign up? It's simple. You and your friends at church need to fill out an entry form and mail it no later than March 31st. You can go to our website www.esfrbc.org click on the TFC link and you'll be able to navigate to the entry form download. Begin to practice on your talent so you can do your very best, but remember no one is expecting you to be perfect. Give it your best, and see how God will use your talent for His glory. Plan to "Share Your Talent" on April 17th.

General Information:

Schedule:

8:00 A.M. Church instruments are available for practice. Be courteous and allow other contestants equal time. There will be a few warm-up rooms available throughout the day. They will have sign-up sheets on their doors.

Divisions:

There are two: Senior High - grades 9 - 10 - 11 - 12

Junior High - grades 6 - 7 - 8

Areas: The Senior High Division has two areas of competition.

Area 1- GARBC Competition/Scholarship

You must intend to enroll in a participating college your freshman year should you become a winner. All scholarship awards are provided by these colleges only. First place winners in our State will be expected to compete in the Nationals Thursday, June 28th at Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Teens who compete on this level must agree to all the specific rules listed in the GARBC rulebook. One will be sent to each contestant when he or she registers with the National Talents for Christ office (deadline - March 2).

Area 2 - Open Competition/ Non-Scholarship

This area is for young people who are not trying to win a scholarship to a participating college. For continuity in quality of competition, the contestant must comply with all the rules of the GARBC with the exception that their church does not have to be in the National GARBC. GARBC rules are available for download at www.garbc.org/tfc or can be sent by the Empire State Fellowship Talents Chairman. (Registration deadline is March 31st.)

National **Open** and **Group** Competition Registration Deadline: May 14th, 2010.

Cost for Open Comopetition: \$30.00

Cost for Group Competition: \$75.00 / group

Dress:

The dignity and responsibility of public ministry for the Lord should be reflected in neat, modest, unostentatious dress. Appropriate attire is required for competition: i.e., dress shirt, tie and suit or jacket for guys, dress (or skirt and blouse) for girls. Failure to adhere to these standards will result in a penalty in scoring. (See exceptions under Drama and Vocal Ensemble.)

Categories:

There are many categories of competition. Teens may enter only ONE. There is an exception to this if you are a member of a drama team or vocal ensemble. Then you may enter one other individual category. The categories with the asterisk are the only ones available in Division 1 - Area 1: The GARBC competition.

Awards:

All contestants receive the benefits of self-discipline, research, practice, mentoring relationships, prayer support and local church backing as they develop their talents for Christ.

Senior High Division:

Area 1 - GARBC Competition/Scholarship

All first-place winners will receive a trophy and a scholarship to a participating college. All cooperating colleges offer a tuition scholarship of \$1,000 during the freshmen year to State first-place winners. First place winners automatically qualify to compete in the National Talents for Christ Contest which will be held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, as part of the GARBC Conference on June 26th. National first-place winners receive a \$5,000 scholarship to the cooperating school of their choice in addition to what they win at State level. This scholarship will be credited in accordance with the college policy. While no definite time limit is attached to the tuition awards, it is recommended that the winners use the scholarships as soon as possible.

Participating schools are Baptist Bible College (PA), Faith Baptist Bible College (IA), Piedmont Baptist College (NC), and Shasta Bible College (CA).

All second-place winners will receive a trophy and a scholarship to a participating college. All cooperating colleges offer a tuition scholarship of \$500 during the freshmen year to State second-place winners. State second-place winners may enter the Nationals as well. (Consult your judges as to whether you are of sufficient caliber to make this a wise expenditure of time, money and effort). Second-place winners in the National will receive a \$2,500 credit to their account in accordance with the college policy.

All third-place winners will receive a medallion.

Area 2 - Open Competition/Non-Scholarship

All first-place and second-place winners will receive trophies. All third-place winners will receive a medallion.

Junior High Division:

All first, second and third-place winners will receive medallions.

Registration:

Senior High - GARBC must mail the form on page 18 entitled, "Use this form to enter the GARBC Scholarship Competition" to Schaumburg, IL. with the \$65 fee by March 2nd or register online at www.garbc.org/tfc. You do NOT need to register with the State Chairman. Mail the GARBC registration to Talents for Christ, 1300 N. Meacham Road, Schaumburg, IL. 60173-4806.

Use the State Registration Form that you can download from the Empire State website www.esfrbc.org for Senior High – Open and Junior High State registrations. Feel free to make extra copies. You can also register online for the State Competition. There is no fee to register for the State competition. Every contestant must mail in the proper official registration entry form NO later than March 1st (postmarked) for Senior High - GARBC, or March 31st (all others). ATTENTION: Senior High students competing in Area 1 – GARBC Competition should enter online or mail the GARBC registration entry form with the \$65 fee (payable to "GARBC/TFC") no later than **March 2nd** to Talents For Christ, 1300 North Meacham Road, Schaumburg, IL 60173-4806. TFC office will notify the State Chairman of those properly registered.

NOTE: Competitors in Senior High ~ Area 1 (GARBC Competition) cannot be official State winners for scholarships unless they are registered with the GARBC Office. Officially entered first- and second-place winners in New York State will automatically qualify to advance to the Nationals after our TFC State chairman sends the results of our State competition to the GARBC Office.

Registration forms MUST be signed by your pastor (or deacon if without a pastor). Each contestant when registering will receive a confirmation letter and final instructions from the State Talents For Christ Chairman. When registered each competitor will receive rules for their category.

Group competitors should send in a registration form for each member of the team.

If, after registering you find you cannot compete, it would be courtesy and help if the State TFC Chairman were informed.

Judging:

It is our policy to award first place in all categories, especially to Junior High and Senior High - Open contestants. However, a first and/or second place winner need not be declared if contestants are not of sufficiently high caliber. The decision of the judges is final. Judges for each category will be chosen from our churches who have known expertise in the areas they will judge. Each adjudication area shall be rated and a final score given to each contestant. The winner is based solely on total points. In case of a tie, the majority vote of the three judges will determine the winner.

Poor Numerical recognition given solely for effort expended; performance itself is poor.
0-2 Points

Fair A fair performance, immature and lacking finesse; needs much further development.
3 -4 Points

Good A good performance, but not outstanding in any respect; needs further development.
5-7 Points

Excellent An excellent performance in most respects; defects in performance or interpretation only minor;
only slightly below superior.
8-9 Points

Superior Represents the best conceivable performance and worthy of being recognized as first place; state
and national champion caliber.
10 Points

Scoring Penalties:

1. Inappropriate dress (all categories). Exception - see Drama and Vocal Ensemble.
2. Exceeding time limits after warning by timekeeper (Oral Interpretation of Scripture, Public Speaking, and Visualized Bible Teaching).
3. Failure to appear according to schedule (all categories).
4. Plagiarism in writing or speaking such as in a close paraphrase or substantial borrowing of content/ideas and representing that material as one's own work (Writing, Public Speaking, Visualized Bible Teaching).
5. Reading from a score or entire manuscript (Piano, Voice, Public Speaking, and Visualized Bible Teaching).
6. Failure to provide the marked score, summary or outline required (Music categories, Oral Interpretation of Scripture, Public Speaking, and Visualized Bible Teaching).
7. Failure to adhere to the instructions under Genre or to specify genre (Writing).

8. Failure to stay within required word count (Writing).
9. Failure to complete the church ministry requirements and turn in the "Local Church Ministry Form" - see Empire State website www.esfbc.org (all categories except Bible Knowledge).
